In addition, the Act calls for the Georgia Composite Medical Board to promulgate and enforce rules and regulations regarding the prohibited forms of medical treatment, requiring such rules to contain various exceptions allowing such treatment. exceptions allow prohibited forms of treatment for: intersex minors; minors with partial androgen insensitivity syndrome; when such treatment is medically necessary; and when a minor began hormone replacement therapy prior to the date of the Act taking effect127
